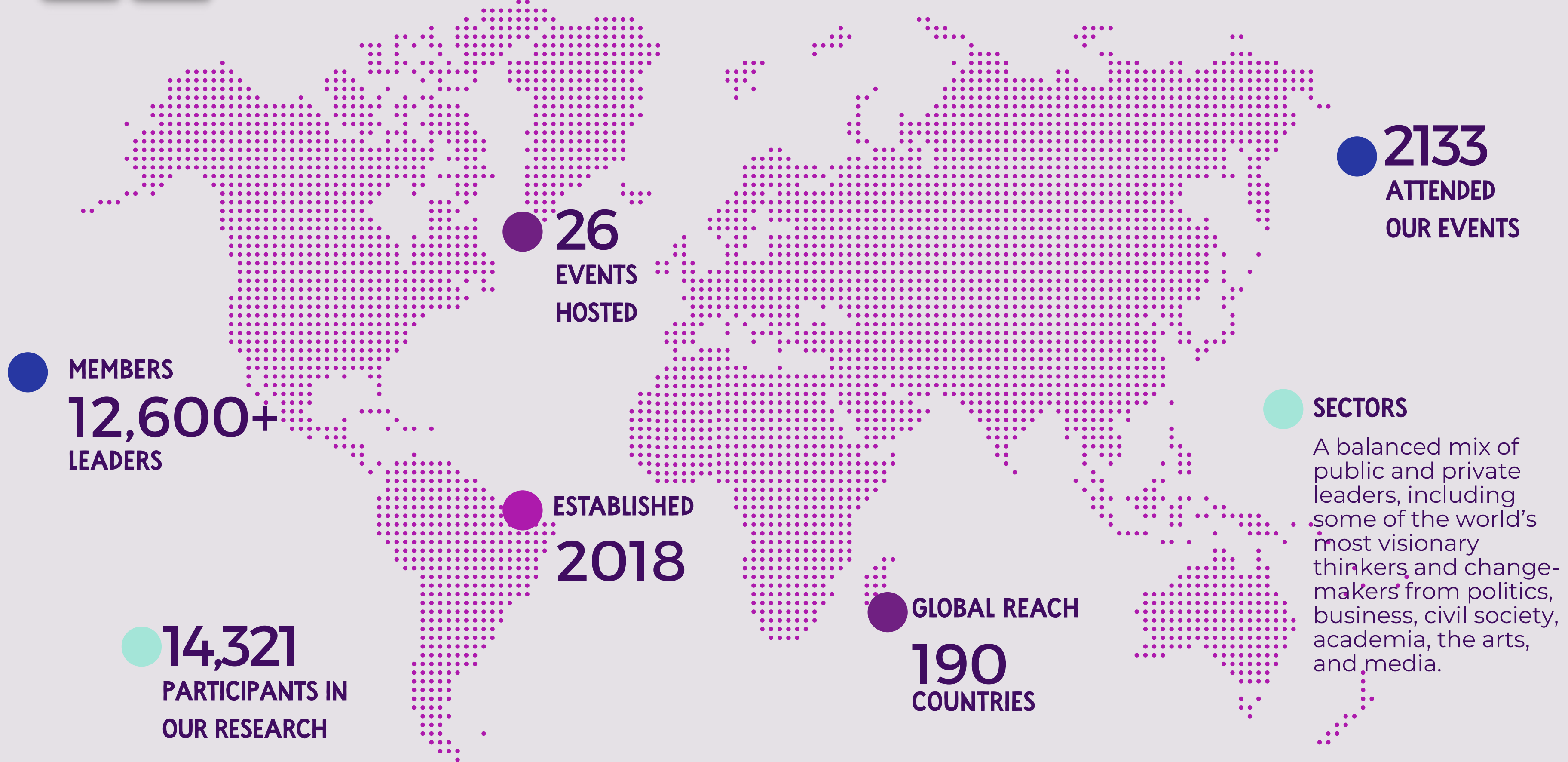

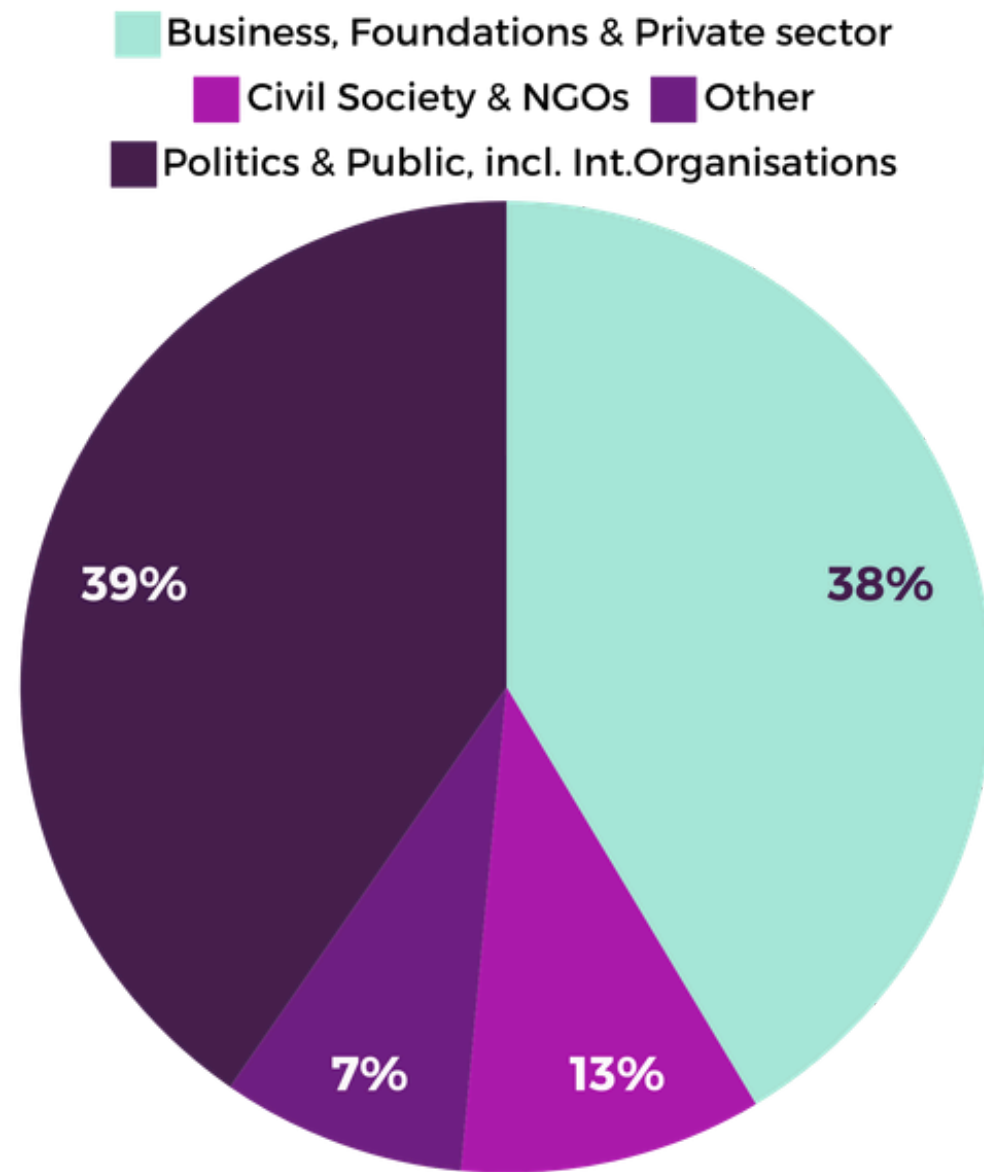

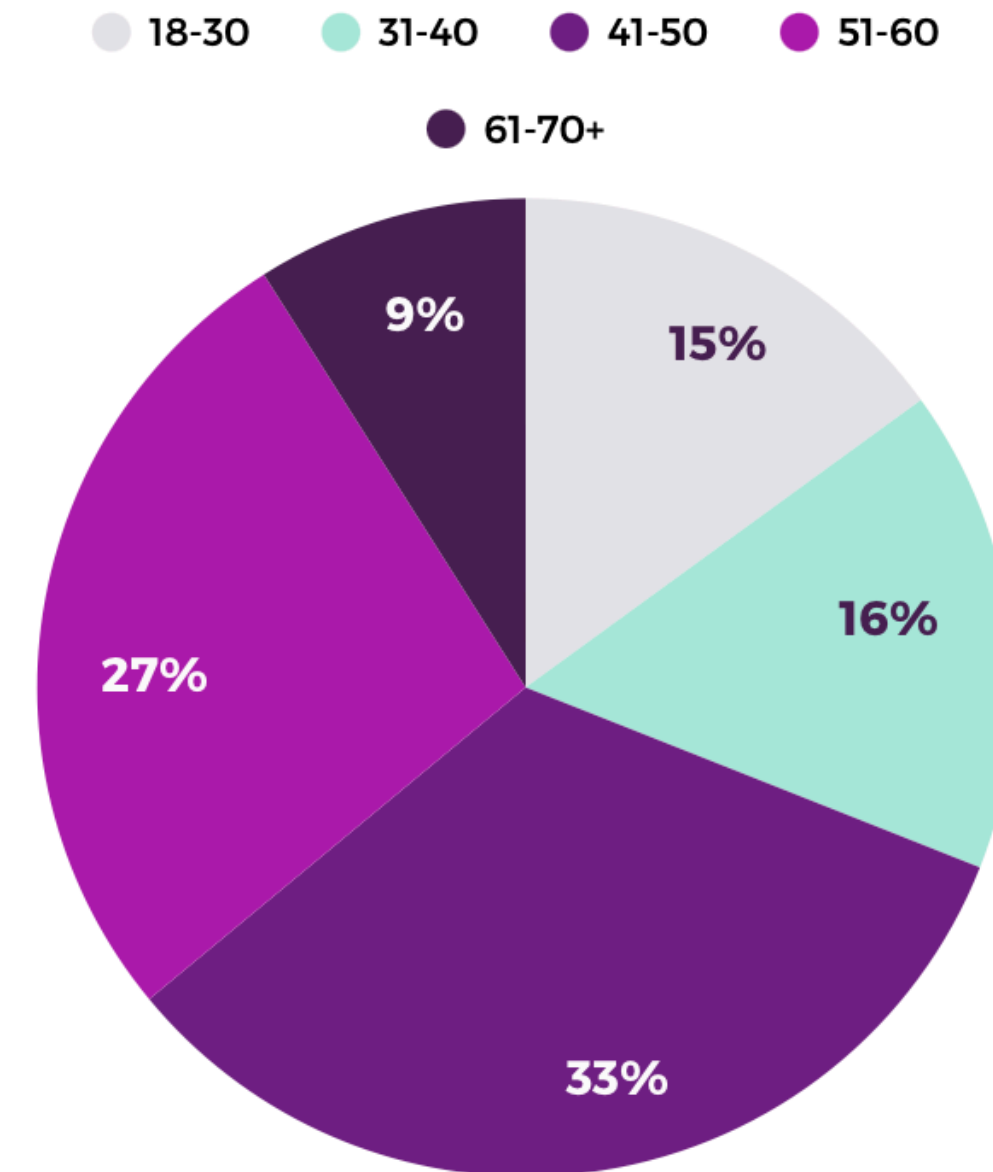


COMMUNITY BREAKDOWN

In 2025 the Reykjavik Global Forum convened under the heading: *Power, Together for Change!*

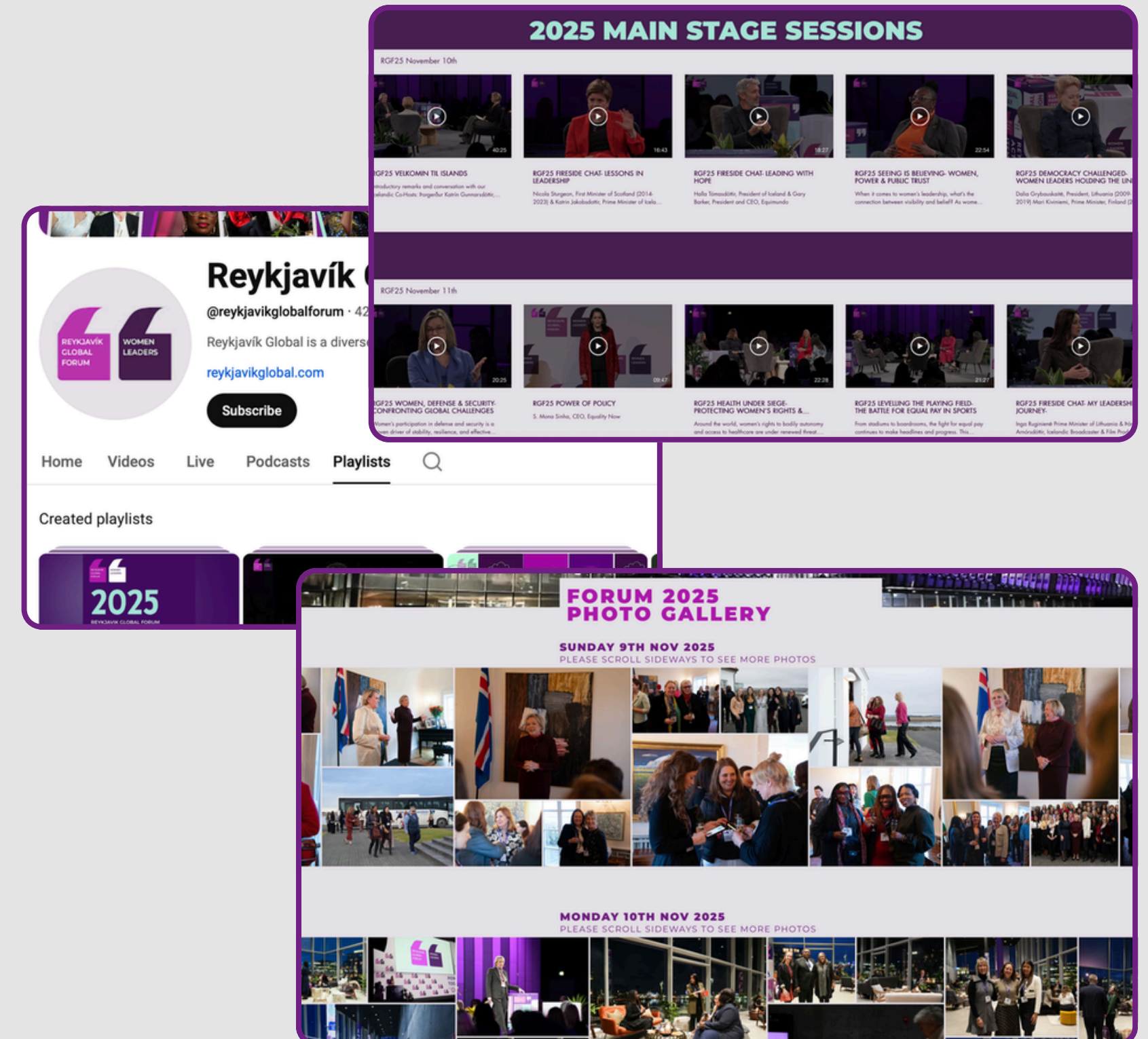
The programme was the most diverse yet and addressed key issues at the intersection of gender and various sectors, to further advance women's influence and power worldwide.

WOMEN IN LEADERSHIP THEMES



RESEARCH & HEALTH

A commitment to evidence-based understanding and improved well-being. This theme highlights the vital role of research in shaping effective health policies, advancing medical innovation, and strengthening systems that support women and communities worldwide.

SUSTAINABLE STABILITY

This theme highlights how enduring progress depends on the full participation and leadership of women, creating the foundations for resilient and inclusive societies. It underscores that when women shape decisions on climate, governance, peace & security, they help secure not only long-term stability but also a more peaceful and balanced future.

ECONOMIC GROWTH

In today's world, economies face new and complex challenges that directly affect economic growth, including employment levels, productivity and GDP. Addressing these challenges requires making full use of available human capital so that economies benefit from higher productivity, more sustainable growth, and stronger long-term economic outcomes.

POLICY & LAW

Focused on the frameworks that shape rights, governance, and long-term societal stability. This theme acknowledges the crucial role of policy and legislation in enabling change, protection freedoms, and creating environments where women's leadership can thrive.

INCLUSIVE INNOVATION

A call to design and deploy new solutions that reflect diverse voices and create shared benefits. This theme celebrates innovation and AI that is accessible, ethical, gender balanced and responsive to real-world needs, ensuring that progress serves society as a whole.

SHARED RESPONSIBILITY

Discussing how responsibility, respect, and accountability are learned and practiced, the focus will be on men and boys as partners in creating fair and inclusive societies. The theme will reflect on positive leadership, role models, and everyday actions that drive change. Together, we emphasize that equality is a shared duty, not a solitary effort.

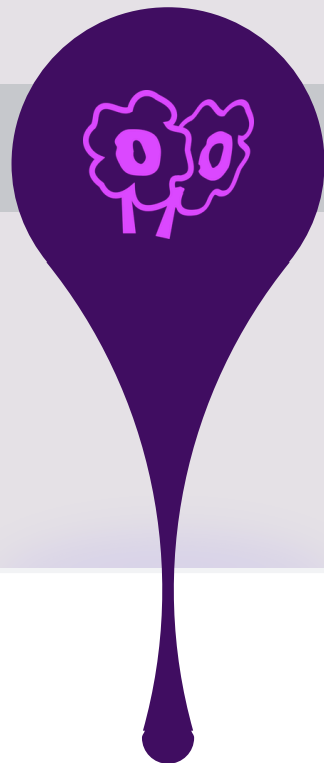

As we look ahead, we do so with renewed confidence in what is possible when we stand united – committed to more equal leadership, to each other, and to shaping a future where every voice can lead."

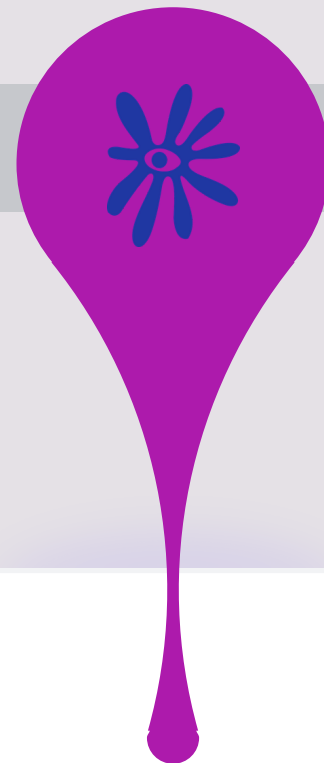
